IN DRAFT PROTEST

17 Demonstrators Given Summonses

Seventeen members of the anti-draft demonstration which degenerated into wild disorder last week have been served summonses, most of them containing dual counts of disorderly conduct and unlawful assembly.

Most of those summoned are University of Arizona students.

One of them, Marshall Johnson, was served yesterday afternoon at the conclusion of another appearance outside the Selective Service offices at 129 S. Scott Ave.

He and six others remained quiet and orderly as they passed out resist-the-draft literature to about 35 young Pima County men boarding buses for Phoenix to take pre-induction physical examinations.

Complaints against the 17 review the pushing, shoving, screaming, fist-slinging, passage-blocking activities Dec. 4 when about 20 picketers at-

tempted to persuade a group of inductees to refuse to be drafted.

Scheduled to appear in City Court at 8:30 a.m. Dec. 20 on counts of disorderly conduct and unlawful assembly are: Judith Abbey, Johnson, Martin L. Lasater, Drew Palette, Carl A. Cole and Jennifer Howard.

Appearances on the same counts are scheduled Dec. 21 for David Rehfield, Thomas Turner, Bradley Littlefield, Mark H. Shenfield, Jonathan Nix, Betsy McDonald and two persons thus far identified only as John Does.

Paul Martin and a third John Doe, each cited only for unlawful assembly, also have a Dec. 21 court appearance date.

Nancy Hedgcock must answer to both disorderly conduct and unlawful assembly counts on Dec. 27.
