Draft Office Changing Its Door Locks

Tucson's Selective Service headquarters at 129 S. Scott Ave., scene of two student anti-draft demonstrations in a week's time, is having the door locks changed.

On Monday afternoon a number of demonstrators gathered near the front of the headquarters to distribute anti-draft material to a group of young men just entering military service.

That evening, when Mrs. Julia C. Lopez, a clerk, tried to lock the front door she was unable to do so.

A building maintenance man, called to check the lock, later told police he found that a sticky substance had been forced into the lock from the outside.

Police said it was not immediately known if this had been done in an attempt to obtain a lock impression on which to fashion a key or was an act of vandalism.

Investigation is continuing.
