UFO 'People' Waved At New Guineans

A University of Arizona meteorology professor has cited a case in which 38 persons saw an unidentified flying object (UFO) on a beach in New Guinea in 1959.

Dr. James E. McDonald told a news conference in Los Angeles yesterday he had an excellent chance to check the facts and witnesses.

He said of the many UFO sightings he has investigated the one in New Guinea remained outstanding.

"This saucer appeared and witnesses said they could see a number of people on top of the UFO. First, one person on the beach waved, then another on the UFO waved back.

"Two people on the beach waved, then two on the vehicle waved. Finally, all 38 witnesses were waving and the four figures were waving back."

McDonald said the figures looked somewhat similar to humans, but witnesses had difficulty in describing their exact shape because the craft was surrounded by a golden glow.

He said the fact mankind can't explain flying saucers doesn't mean they are not possible.

"I have no bright ideas where they come from," he said. "It does not seem very likely that they come from other planets within our solar system."
